Barjac Ombre is a wonderful technique made with continuous threads. It has a unique two twist ground on a Torchon grid with beautiful floral motifs. It is easy and fun to make. Patterns will be made available for all levels, beginners to advanced students of Barjac Ombrée.


**PREREQUISITES**: The class is suitable for all lacemakers who are comfortable with Torchon and can also read a diagram. **Masks** by personal choice and are not required. The teacher will wear a mask if requested.



Ulrike has been a full-time professional lace teacher for 40 years and has written more than 30 books on bobbin lace covering multiple techniques. She has traveled throughout much of the world teaching bobbin lace as well as participating in exhibitions and competitions across Europe.

# Binche Lace, Beginning and Continuing, plus Rosaline Kumiko Nakazaki

Binche is a continuous Belgian straight lace, rich in design and embellished with snowflake and fivehole grounds. Beginners, intermediate and advanced students to Binche are welcome in this course.

Lacemakers who also want to try to design their own patterns and study drafting are also welcome. If you would like to try your hand at Rosaline this is your chance. Each student should contact the teacher prior to the course to choose a pattern at the appropriate level.

PREREQUISITES: Students at all levels of bobbin lace making are accepted but they need to have solid bobbin lace fundamentals. Masks are optional.



Kumiko has studied bobbin lace in Bruges, Belgium. She specializes in Binche and Flanders and Duchesse. She has been designing and teaching lace since 2000.


# **Bucks Point, Bedfordshire, Lester and Honiton** *Holly Van Sciver*

This class offers the lacemaker the option of working Honiton (flat or raised and rolled), Bucks Point (geometric or floral), Beds/Lester, or Contemporary at any level. Honiton lace is a beautiful English free lace depicting images from nature and is the gateway to interpretive lacemaking of pictorial images. Bucks Point is an English continuous bobbin lace and is characterized by a delicate ground and a pattern outlined by a gimp thread. Bedfordshire is a continuous lace with a plaited ground. It is a great opportunity to learn any of these laces for the first time or to pursue continuing projects. **Masks are optional.** 

**PREREQUISITES:** Strong bobbin lace fundamentals.










Holly has been a student and teacher of lacemaking for 49 years. Originally trained in England, she specializes in teaching the 19th century English laces. She has taught and lectured in the United States, Canada and Europe for the International Organization of Lace, regional lace guilds, national lace conferences, museums, historical societies, universities, and professional organizations. Using an interdisciplinary approach, Holly is a leader in teaching the fundamentals underlying lacemaking theory and design. She is the founder of the Finger Lakes Lace Guild and owner of Van Sciver Bobbin Lace, which has served to promote lacemaking worldwide since 1981.







### Flanders, Withof and Torchon

Lions and tigers and bears...! How about Torchon, Flanders and Withof!! If you have any UFOs on your pillows or would like to learn a new lace, this will be a fun and informative class. Torchon is a continuous lace and is good for those who have made a bit of lace in the past and would like to get back into it. You can have fun with bookmarks in color or continue with a piece that is already on your pillow. Flanders is a continuous lace with a unique 5 hole ground from the Flanders region in Belgium. This course is good for those who have a background in Torchon and would like to try something new or those who already have a start in the lace and would like to improve upon their skills. Withof is considered a "cut thread" lace. Each section is attached by sewings to another section of the piece. Masks are not required.


**PREREQUISITES: Torchon -** previous lacemaking experience. Knowledge of terms such as, footside, headside, cloth stitch and half stitch. **Flanders** - Strong Torchon experience. **Withof** - Strong knowledge of lace and lacemaking terms.



Kathy Kauffmann has been a lacemaker for more than 40 years with more than 35 years of teaching experience. She began her studies in Paris at Le Centre d'Enseignement de la Dentelle. She has studied many types of lace with her favorites being Withof, Flanders and Binche. She is the co-author of "Withof in North America" along with Susie Johnson and Carol Watson. She also co-authored "Flanders" with Michael Giusiana and Marianne Stang.







# Idrija Lace in Living Color

Explore Idrija lace using color. In this class, students will choose from various nature themed patterns and learn how to add and remove various colored threads to "color" their pattern as they work. Tips for shading and creating a variegated look will be given. Color choices are personal preference and shades of white (white, ecru, and beige) can also be used. Patterns will range from beginner to advanced.




**PREREQUISITES:** Working knowledge of basic bobbin lace stitches and Torchon is required. **Masks are optional.** 

Allie Marguccio is a retired elementary school librarian, lacemaker, and lace teacher. Bobbin lacemaking is a tradition that had been passed down through generations in her European family. In 2008, Allie was award a grant by the Pennsylvania Counsel on the Arts to study traditional lace making techniques in Slovenia under the tutelage of Master Teacher, Stand Frelih of the Idrija School in Idrija, Slovenia.

Allie teaches private classes in her home in West-Central Pennsylvania where she lives, and has taught numerous workshops regionally and throughout the United States. Her work has been exhibited at The Bottle Works Ethnic Arts Center in Johnstown, Pennsylvania and at the Governor's Mansion in Harrisburg, Pennsylvania. She has contributed articles to IOLI's Lace Bulletin and has been featured in several local newspapers. Allie is one of four folk artists featured in the 2018 PBS documentary titled, "Pennsylvania Traditions: Woven Together". Her video, "The Basics of Idrija Lace Technique" filmed and produced by John and Kathy Hensel, was launched in October of 2020. She is a member of numerous lace guilds. She has begun designing her own lace patterns in the Idrija lace narrow tape technique.

### Accommodation

Accommodation will be in Galilee, Bethany and Wesley Lodges and will be assigned by lottery. Galilee bedrooms sleep 2-4 people with some rooms having an en-suite bathroom and some individual shared bathrooms. In Bethany there will be 1 person per bedroom using an individual bathroom shared by one other bedroom. Wesley has 2-4 people per room with a shared bathroom. This is a retreat center so the rooms are simple but clean.
